

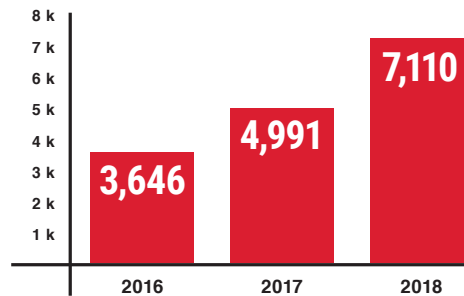
FACT SHEET KEY STATISTICS

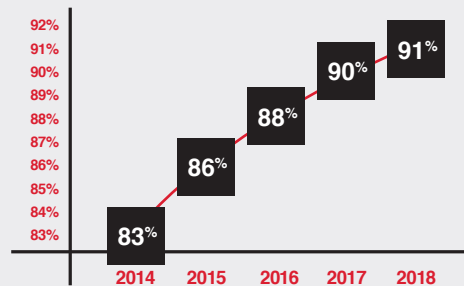

VIRAL SUPPRESSION AMONG OUR PATIENTS

Our highest priority is to help all people living with HIV achieve viral suppression to protect their health and the health of our communities. People living with HIV who achieve viral suppression are not only healthier, they are also unable to transmit HIV to others—an important step in stopping the spread of HIV.



DEDICATED TO LIFESAVING HIV PREVENTION

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) is one of the most powerful HIV prevention strategies available. When taken as prescribed, PrEP reduces the risk of contracting HIV from sex by more than 90%. Unfortunately, most people at-risk for HIV continue to face barriers in accessing it. Through direct outreach, counseling, and testing services, our PrEP program is increasing the number of people from all walks of life who can receive PrEP.

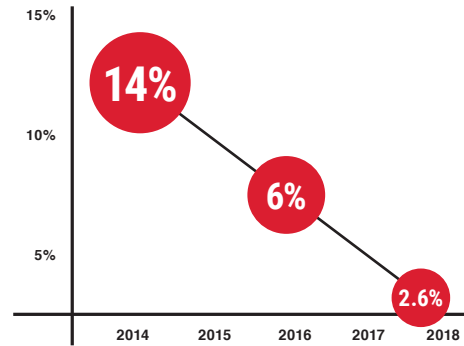

PARTNERS IN STOPPING THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC

For 25 years, we have fought the opioid crisis with lifesaving services designed to meet people facing addiction where they are at. Our Lifepoint program includes clean needle exchanges, referrals to substance abuse treatment, and access to Naloxone, which helps prevent death from drug overdoses.
